BACKGROUND PAPER - SESSION 4

BUILDING A ROLLING WORK PROGRAMME FOR INDUSTRY

This document maps potential areas of work for the coming years. This includes aspects for direct lead by the EEA and this NRC, but, also, areas where suggestions could be pur forward to the European Commission. The discussion will be, structured around three main topics: 1) reporting activities, 2) assessments and 3) international discussions of relevance for this NRC.

INPUT EXPECTED FROM COUNTRIES

Countries are expected to reflect on the ideas included in this document and provide their views as well as, potentially, additional ideas for inclusion in EEA's future annual work programme. Specific questions to prepare a country position are:

- What are the key strategic priorities to improve the reporting processes and the quality of data?
- How can the EU level best support countries in their tasks of collating data, disseminating it and assess policies in a data-bound manner?
- 3. What are the areas where broadening the scope of this NRC can best influence in the policy cycle?

TOPICS FOR DISCUSSION

1. REPORTING ACTIVITIES

The NRC on industrial pollution is responsible for the following ongoing reporting exercises:

- Reporting to the EU Registry on Industrial Sites
- Reporting to the European Pollutant Release and Transfer Register
- Reporting on emissions and energy input from Combustion Plants

The following upcoming reporting obligations fall under the remit of this NRC:

- Reporting on integrated emission management techniques applied in mineral oil refineries according to <u>Decision 2014/768/EU</u>. This reporting exercise will cover 2017-2019 and is due by 30 September 2020.
- Reporting on medium-sized combustion plants, as provided by <u>Directive 2015/2193/EU</u>.
 This reporting obligation has a first deadline on January 1, 2021.
- Reporting on implementation aspects of <u>Directive 2010/T5/EU</u>.
 The legal act covering this reporting obligation is being discussed, <u>at the moment</u>, in the relevant Committee. However, the current proposal provides that reporting will start in

- EU Registry on Industrial Sites
 - Including new IED implementation elements
- European Pollutant Release and Transfer Register (E-PRTR) + Reporting on Combustion plants (LCP)
- New dataflows
 - Mineral Oil Refineries (monitoning of BATc) By Sep 2020
 - Medium-sized Combustion Plants by Jan 2021
